LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

Supporters and Stakeholders of St. Vincent de Paul (SVdP):

I write to express my appreciation for your support and to share Contra Costa County SVdP's annual report. I am a volunteer working with over 700 volunteers (we call ourselves Vincentians). I'd like to share a couple very common questions we receive from folks who call to request our help.

Does your "agency" help with water bills, PG&E bills, gasoline, food, furniture, rent, etc.? When is your office open?



SVdP helps people find jobs.

Our answers:

"That is possible," or "We have done that before."

"We can meet on your schedule; we will come to you at a time convenient for your family."

We believe "no act of charity is foreign to the Society". We listen carefully to their situation with the intention to help address their immediate problem and to assess how we can assist with their long-term needs. Examples include: obtaining a license, providing a phone and service for communication and job search, changing a tire, providing auto parts, a bicycle, a bus pass, a ride to the doctor, hospital or social security office, helping move furniture and belongings, referral to a shelter, a counselor, or a clinic, prescriptions or eye glasses.

We report results of our 2015-2016 year. We quantify the tangible assistance provided. While the more valuable delivery is the compassionate and caring way Vincentians listen to their story, assisting, prioritizing actions that are taken shoulder to shoulder with our neighbor. Although the volunteers outnumber the staff 30 to 1, we have full and part time staff (some are in transitional employment entering or reentering the workforce). They support the operation of our stores (that sell and distribute to those in need), transportation of donations, the free clinic, free dining room, dental assistance, day shelter, food acquisition and distribution.

I write to thank you, whether you are a donor, staff, volunteer or partner. Your contribution provides immediate and tangible assistance and the longer term impact we have on the lives of the neighbors and their children. Our prayer is that we deliver hope and you are part of that.




ABOUT SARAH
