We are pleased to present the 2012-2013 Annual Report of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul of Contra Costa County, As you will see, the volunteers and staff are powerfully assisting our neighbors in need, providing hope and help in these challenging times. The data reflect how our Society is living the spirit of Pope Francis to "hear the cry of the poor".

To be good social service providers, we try to understand the broad challenges facing the impoverished people in our community—their pressing day-to-day needs and the systemic causes of their poverty. We are committed to serving their needs and empowering the poor with solutions that work.

For 50 years, the Society in Contra Costa County has humbly cared for people in need throughout the County. More than 500 volunteers care for people in their own parish neighborhoods. The Society offers immediate help -- food, gas, utilities, and rental assistance. We also operate a free health clinic in cooperation with RotaCare Bay Area and local Rotary Clubs, a free dining room in cooperation with Loaves and Fishes.

And our Workforce Development Program provides the essential tools for long-term employment. It is a rigorous, 24 week, paid, part-time on-the-job training program that teaches hard and soft skills that the long-term unemployed critically need to find lasting employment. It is life-changing!

To be good stewards of the gifts so generously entrusted to the Society, we prioritize spending our limited resources wisely.

Our strength lies in our personal contact with the people we serve and the range of services we offer. 


## **ABOUT KELLY**
