Art Prindle – A Vincentian life of Service at St. Stephen's by John Prindle, St. Stephen's Catholic Church

Art Prindle was called to service with SVdP at Saint Stephen's Parish over 30 years ago. Working as a teacher and principal in the Lafayette school district for 37 years, he heard a story which touched his heart as he neared retirement.

There was a man from Vietnam in the area who needed some housing assistance. St. Vincent de Paul of Contra Costa County stepped in to help him find housing. Once housed, the man became a custodian at Saint Stephen's where he worked for many years.

This story touched Art deeply, and he began to reflect on what it means to help another person. A short time later, and he was asked to begin his ministry with the society.

Art said, "It makes you feel good to be able to help somebody. Our faith tells us that everyone is equal and if there is somebody in need we ought to help that person."

Art has worn many hats as a Vincentian, and loved the work he has done to help his neighbors in need. He has helped stock food pantries and distribute food to the hungry. He has helped provide furniture and housing for those without shelter. He also served as the President of his parish chapter, where he has been a member since 1968 when the church first opened. As a Vincentian, Art has been able to touch the lives of those in need within his community.

Beginning May 17, 2021, 13,000 Vincentians from 400 St. Vincent de Paul Conferences and Councils in the Western Region participated in the 2021 Western Region Meetings! This was the first year so many Vincentians had the chance to participate. By going virtual these workshops were able to host far more people than we could have in person.

The meetings started with an introduction to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul presented in English and Spanish, and a reflection of the successes and set-backs of the last year by the Western Region Vice President of the National Council of the US, John Hallissy. The meeting also featured a tribute to the Vincentians in the Western Region who passed away in 2020.

Sr. Paule Freeburg, Daughter of Charity and Spiritual Advisor for the Western Region, then led us on a journey that would last all five days with a presentation and Reflections to "Seek and Find the Forgotten." Each day's theme examined social issues which had risen during the past year from a Vincentian perspective. These reflections served to prepare us for our return from pandemic isolation to meet again together with Christ as we serve the poor.


On June 1st, Tuesdays with Vincent will focus on the topic "The Congregation of the Mission," and how St. Vincent de Paul brought people together to help those in need.

Presenter Bio: Rev. Thomas F. McKenna, C.M.



Thomas F. McKenna has been a member of the Congregation of the Mission since 1963. He grew up in Brooklyn, New York and he attended schools there, in New Jersey and in Pennsylvania until his ordination in 1970.

He received an M.A. in philosophy from St. John's University in New York in 1973 and a ThM from Mary Immaculate Seminary in Northampton, Pennsylvania in 1974.

He spent fifteen years in seminary work including time as the Director of Novices for the Eastern Province of the Vincentians, as well as Rector of their college seminary in Niagara Falls, New York.

He earned a doctorate in systematic theology from the Catholic University of America in 1982. For ten years, he taught Spirituality as a tenured member of the theology department at St. John's University. He has published a book on St. Vincent de Paul, articles in various theological journals and has been involved in retreat work nationally and internationally, especially within the Vincentian Family.

For more than twenty years he was part of his Congregation's leadership team, where he served as the Assistant Provincial then as Provincial completing his term in 2008.

Since then, he has taught theology at Tangaza University in Nairobi, Kenya, and also at Niagara University. Additionally, at Niagara he functioned as Assistant to the President for Mission. For six years he served in St. Louis as the Provincial Director of the St. Louise Province of the Daughters of Charity. Most recently, Rev. McKenna has worked as Formation Director for the Vincentian major seminarians in Philadelphia as well as again taking up the role of Assistant Provincial.


In order that he might better respond to a wide variety of needs, St. Vincent de Paul brought together as many people as he could, rich and poor, humble and powerful, and used every means to inspire in them a sensitivity to the poor, who are the privileged image of Christ. He moved them to help the poor directly and indirectly (Constitutions of the Congregation of the Mission, Introduction, p.19).

The purpose of the Congregation of the Mission is to follow Christ evangelizing the poor. This purpose is achieved when, faithful to St. Vincent, the members individually and collectively: (1) make every effort to put on the spirit of Christ himself (Common Rules I:3) in order to acquire a holiness appropriate to their vocation (Common Rules XII:13); (2) work at evangelizing the poor, especially the more abandoned; (3) help the clergy and laity in their formation and lead them to a fuller participation in the evangelization of the poor (Constitutions, #1).

From the time of its founder, the members of the Congregation of the Mission recognized that they had been called by God to continue the mission of evangelizing those persons who are poor.

Free Dental Clinic Scheduled to Open in June

The Dentist on Wheels Pittsburg Free Dental Clinic at St. Vincent de Paul is scheduled to open this June – offering free dental care for Contra Costa residents without dental insurance. The clinic is a collaboration between Dentists on Wheels (DOW) and St. Vincent de Paul of Contra Costa County (SVdP), the free dental clinic aims to address the problem of extreme dental pain experienced by residents in Contra Costa County who have no dental insurance. The 3-chair free dental clinic will soon be ready to start treating patients and helping people in need in the county to resolve their dental pain. All the dental equipment and furnishings have been donated to the free clinic. Shab Farzaneh, founder of Dentists on Wheels saw a community need and was moved to provide a solution.

The clinic, staffed by volunteer dentists, will be able to treat most patients' needs, everything from screenings, cleanings and check-ups to fillings, crowns, extractions and dentures.

For many patients, there is a direct link between poverty and a lack of dental insurance. Receiving dental care would normally be out of reach for low-income residents. Tooth pain and other dental issues can cause a massive drop in quality of life for those suffering. A broadening problem in low-income communities is the usage of extraction to solve tooth pain, as it is an inexpensive means of addressing the pain. This can create many long-term issues that can profoundly impact the patient's quality of life. By providing accessible preventative care and restorative procedures, the free dental clinic will lessen the number of extractions happening in Contra Costa County and keep the county smiling.
