☀ Who We Are

The Society of St. Vincent de Paul ("SVdP") is an international organization devoted to serving the poor. SVdP of Contra Costa County offers resources to our neighbors in need through community-based services, thrift stores, and several safety-net programs.

We believe that each person should be embraced with compassion and dignity. We believe in helping our neighbors who lack basic human needs such as food, shelter, and clothing. On average, we respond to 140,000 service contacts from county residents each year.

☀ What We Do

Neighborhood-Based Branches (Conferences)

SVdP provides help and support to the needy and vulnerable through our 28 community-based branches, called Conferences. Our county-wide network of over 700 volunteers (known as Vincentians) provide food, rental & utility assistance, and other services to help people overcome their individual challenges.

Thrift Stores

Our two thrift stores provide free and low-cost clothing, housewares, and furniture to those in need. Revenues from our stores provide financial support to our safety net programs.

SVdP of Contra Costa – Turning Compassion Into Action

☀ Our Programs

SVdP hosts a range of programs to serve our community members in need at our Family Resource Center, 2210 Gladstone Drive, Pittsburg, and local assistance through 28 branches throughout the county.

Dining Room

SVdP partners with Loaves & Fishes of Contra Costa County to provide free, hot meals to the hungry every weekday.

Food Pantry

SVdP partners with the Food Bank of Contra Costa and Solano counties, restaurants, and supermarkets to provide emergency groceries to individuals and families in need throughout the week. Our neighborhood-based branches operate 21 community food pantries throughout the county.

Rotacare Pittsburg Free Medical Clinic at St. Vincent De Paul

SVdP partners with RotaCare Bay Area to provide quality medical care to uninsured adults with acute or chronic medical conditions. Patients receive free medical care from volunteer medical providers.

Dental Program

SVdP partners with La Clinica to deliver adult dental care for uninsured members of the community providing access to dental exams, x-rays, and assistance for chronic conditions.

Workforce Development

The Workforce Development Program helps those entering and/or reentering the workforce (may have a history of addiction or incarceration, low educational attainment, or other hardships) by providing paid on-the-job training, mentoring, and soft skills courses in a 24-week program.

Daytime Shelter

SVdP partners with the Interfaith Council of Contra Costa County's Winter Nights Shelter Program by providing a daytime refuge for families so those experiencing homelessness have a warm, comfortable environment to come to on weekdays.

Housing Assistance

SVdP partners with Catholic Charities of the East Bay and Seasons of Sharing to provide rental housing assistance to prevent individuals and families from becoming homeless.
