(DC Meeting Special Presentation on Mental Illness Cont.)

Mary is the current president of NAMI Tuolumne County and has been very active in that organization for over twenty years. NAMI stands for National Alliance on Mental Illness. In the early 2000s, she started a self-funded housing program for people living with a mental illness. That program consisted of mostly two-bedroom apartments with one person in each bedroom. Her main problem was roommate issues, so she wanted to start a program with completely separate spaces for each person. Through the local Tri-County Continuum of Care, Mary was able to start a HUD Housing and Urban Development funded program with what the government terms SROs, single resident occupancy rooms.

Mary and her husband, John, have manned a warm line for NAMI for over 20 years, so they have taken calls from people with all kinds of mental health issues and in many different levels of crisis. She will be speaking on the different types of mental illness and how different people perceive reality. Each person is unique, of course, but Mary will describe some best practice ways of communicating with people in crisis and in everyday situations. There are ways of working with people so that they are more likely to feel respected and heard and are therefore more likely to hear and understand what is being told them.

Mary and John are active in their parish of All Saints in Twain Harte, a small village in the Sierras. They are the parents of 6 children and have 14 grandchildren. They enjoy hiking and kayaking and life in the mountains in general.

The Hope Conference Today

The Hope Conference has:

- 1) A Water Debt Relief Fund.
- 2) Mortgage/Rental Assistance Fund.

In both cases, 3 months of mortgage, rent, or water bills can be covered. Clients must have incomes lower than 200% of the Federal Poverty Level (FPL), and in the case of the mortgage/rental fund, the household must identify being impacted by the pandemic in some way, (household income reduced, family member sick, household expenses increased, etc.).


