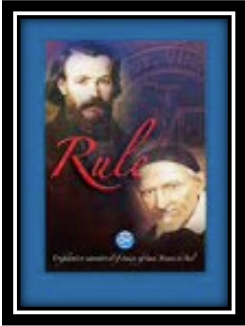

How we tell our story, our neighbors' stories, and how we share with the community our service to our neighbors in need, are essential parts of our communications efforts. From our newsletters to our social media posts to our e-blasts to this newsletter – what and how we say something matters. So, what is Aggregation, or is a Conference Aggregated? Why is it important?

The Standards of Excellence for District Councils asks if all the conferences are aggregated. We have already discussed this and National gave us a list of six conferences that are not aggregated (On the record with National):

St. David of Wales

St. John the Baptist

St. John Vianney

St. Mark

St. Monica

St. Patrick

These three conferences think they are aggregated:

St. David of Wales – Confident they are, but cannot find any paperwork

St. John the Baptist – found the request, but not the final aggregation.

St. John Vianney – Confident they are, but cannot find any paperwork

The last two have no record of applying for aggregation.

“Aggregation is the recognition your Conference and its connection directly to the SSVP in Paris and founding of the Society.” Yes, not being recognized (Aggregated) will prevent you from being able to take advantage grants offered from the National Office of SVDP. But it is much more than that. It started with Vincent. As the arms of Society grew branches beginning with the Confraternities of Charity (Ladies of Charity) began to carry our ministry all over the world, the branches wanted to seek recognition and confirmation of their connection that they were part of the seminal work of Vincent de Paul. When Rosalee Rundu was introduced by Emmanuel Bailly (the Society of St. Vincent de Paul’s first President) to Frederic Ozanam and re-introduced these young men to “Go to the Poor” again they wanted to be connected to the heartbeat of our Charism.

Ten years ago, the SVDP National Office lost a great number of their records of who was aggregated and who was not. I would like to make sure all our Conferences in Contra Costa County are recognized. We have listings of some of our Conferences as being Aggregated and some not.

Last week I had the privilege of joining a bunch of the Vincentians from the St. Joan of Arc Conference for Mass. As you walk in the main door of St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church directly in front of you is a wall dedicated to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul and the Conference of St. Vincent de Paul at St. Joan of Arc. Directly in the center are their articles of Aggregation.

If your Conference does not have a physical copy of the Articles of Aggregation send Stephen Krank your Conference's name, and president’s email address, and he will submit (or resubmit) your application.



Frederic's E-Gazette – is the weekly newsletter of the National Council. Yes, it comes too frequently. Yes, it repeats a lot of stuff every month. Yes, it has a lot of information you don't care about. But every so occasionally, it has something that will make you a better Vincentian. Our Vincentian Home Visit

WHY DO WE DO THE VINCENTIAN HOME VISIT?

Vincentians believe that when we visit the poor, we have the chance to meet Christ?

Frederic Ozanam stated that the home visit to the poor was “our principal work.” He reported regularly on the number of visits that various conferences had made. He saw the visitor and the visited as intimately united.

In 1836, he wrote, “We rejoice that the number of families that we are going to visit is growing because it seems to us that they form, with the members who visit them, two parts of the same society. Those who are helped provoke and revive the charity of those who help them: In this way, they assist each other, they live in the same spirit, and all find shelter under the mantle of St. Vincent de Paul.”

As a Society -Two by Two we have been doing Home Visits ... for 400 Years.

In 1617 when he (Vincent de Paul) founded the Confraternities of Charity, (Ladies of Charity) Vincent directed members to go two by two to the homes of the sick and disadvantaged.

In 1625 when he founded the Congregation of the Mission Vincent (Vincentian Priests) wrote: “We ... always go out two by two” during missions to visit the homes of the marginalized.”

In 1633 when Vincent and Louise de Marillac founded the (Daughters of Charity), He placed huge emphasis on visits to the sick poor. Such visits were among the most striking characteristics of this new community of sisters.

From the Society’s beginning, the central and most basic activity of Conferences has been the visitation of the needy in their homes. This is the clearest symbol of our Vincentian charism, which dictates the highest respect for the dignity of the poor. It symbolizes our Vincentian commitment to reach out to the needy, rather than require them to report to an outside service site. In the home, needy persons feel most free to confide their stories of struggle. In that family setting, Vincentians are asked to listen, offer humble advice, and render assistance.

If each leave with an understanding of the resources available and how they can access what we do for those they serve, it would be a success and time well spent for each.

Our Agenda

- RotaCare Pittsburg Free Medical Clinic at St. Vincent de Paul. (Roughly 19,000 patient visits) this year - 553 +/-.
- Oasis - Winter Nights Day Shelter - Families with their kids.
- Workforce Development Program - Providing Reentry, Mentorship, and paid Training to folks returning to the workforce through our Thrift Stores & Recycling programs. We are in our third or fourth cycle this year.
- Dentist on Wheels Pittsburg Free Dental Clinic at St. Vincent de Paul - Our Three Chair Dental Clinic averages 25 patients per month (scope of services include: crowns, root canals, dentures, etc.)
- Free Dining Room, operated in partnership with Loaves and Fishes of Contra Costa - Provides 150 - 200 hot meals daily.
- 25+ ongoing pantries across the County with (4) primary distributions, each providing for 100 + families per week: Brentwood, Pittsburg, El Sobrante, and each Tuesday serving Byron, Knightson & Bethel Island.
- Three Thrift Stores & Warehouse provide free clothing to the homeless and low-cost furniture and act as the primary worksite for our Workforce Development Program.
- HOPE - Housing, Utility Assistance, Car Repair (provided \$1,015,290. +/- FY 2021-22) through the branches in 28 local Communities in Contra Costa County)
- Emergency Food, Hygiene, Showers & Clothing for the Homeless.
- Auto Donation Program - Providing access to safe working vehicles where not having access is creating a barrier to sustainability.
