I ride my bike for the same reason. Not only does riding allow me to calm down, but I am free to think about how to deal with various issues. And, of course, it is often a good time to pray.

If you haven't done it already, now is the time to accept the fact that you cannot help everyone in the way that you would like. Sometimes you might only be able to say a kind word to them, tell them to call 211 and that you will pray for them.

Sometimes that is enough.






