

Grants are out there, available from private foundations and government programs.

Conference member or members can and must do this--hiring a grant writer is too expensive. Grant applications are time intensive.

Resources--Online searches, e.g., <u>http://www.causeiq.com.; irs.gov</u> (Charities and Nonprofits button to find IRS filings); <u>grantstation.com</u> ("We feature profiles of thousands of grant makers in an easy-to-read, narrative format."), subscription \$179 a year, probably not worthwhile.

Grant applications must describe the need, the way your Conference or project will address the need, and how your program will succeed or examples of how you have succeeded.





Holy Spirit Conference Transition to Permanent Housing Solutions

Since the program began operation in December 2018, TPHS has helped 491 people in 184 households and expended \$227,777 to do so.

Grants received total approximately \$230,000.

Who Can Apply?

•Aggregated SVdP Conferences in good standing

•Instituted SVdP District Councils in good standing (Diocesan Councils are not eligible)

•Applicants must have 501(c)(3) status with the IRS

What Can Grant Funds Be Used For?

- •Rental/housing assistance
- •Utility assistance
- •Food/clothing assistance
- Medical assistance
- Transportation assistance
- •Baby/children needs



Grant funds cannot be used for Twinning, Extension, building projects, or any purpose other than those identified above.



Grant Awards and Reporting Requirements

Grant awards may vary from the application amount, but will not exceed \$5,000
Any funds awarded must be fully utilized within six months
A grant report must be submitted within six months, using the National Council Grant Reporting Form.

•A detailed financial accounting of all grant funds, impact numbers, and a success story are required.



Friends of the Poor[®] Grant Application Submission Dates"

•Western, South Central, Northeast Regions: September 1 – 15 (awards announced on December 30) Grant applications will only be accepted during the submission period dates. No early or late application will be considered.
