<u>STRENGTHENING OUR</u> CONFERENCE THROUGH SHARED LEADERSHIP:

Ideas For Delegating Responsibilities from SVDP National Office

Every active Vincentian in a Conference should be empowered with a meaningful role. Not only does this increase participation and foster ownership, but it also ensures that the vital work of serving our neighbors in need is sustained and shared. No two Conferences are precisely alike, so how you structure your team may look different from another group, but the goal is the same: to serve with love, humility, and effectiveness.

St. Vincent de Paul once said, "When working with the poor, we see them as 'our masters, the poor,' and **we do all that we reasonably can** to bring them the love of God and to assist them materially."

This guiding principle reminds us that each act of service is sacred, and every role within the Conference—no matter how small—contributes to this holy mission.

Below are ideas for roles and responsibilities that can help you delegate tasks and ensure your Conference remains vibrant, inclusive, and mission-driven.

Leadership and Governance Roles

• President

Coordinates overall activities of the Conference. Serves as servant-leader for all members.

• Vice-President(s)

Assumes duties when the President is unavailable. Can also chair a committee or lead a special project.

• Secretary

Notifies members of meetings, records minutes, and handles Conference correspondence.

- Assistant Secretary Takes minutes in the absence of the Secretary and supports administrative tasks.
- **Treasurer** Manages Conference finances and coordinates closely with the Secretary on financial reporting.
- Assistant Treasurer Supports the Treasurer—could handle specific payments (e.g., utility kiosk payments) or bookkeeping duties.
- **Spiritual Advisor** Prepares and leads prayer and reflection during meetings, and helps deepen the spiritual life of the Conference.
- Assistant Spiritual Advisor Leads reflections when the Advisor is unavailable; assists with planning retreats and spiritual celebrations.

Parish & Community Engagement Roles

- **Pastoral Council Representative** Represents the Conference on the Parish Pastoral Council, sharing Vincentian priorities and updates.
- Youth Liaison

Connects with parish youth and Religious Education staff to engage young people in service and Vincentian spirituality.

- **Sunday Bulletin Correspondent** Writes short updates and announcements to keep the parish informed about Conference activities.
- Recruitment Chair

Organizes recruitment efforts, invites new members, and welcomes them into the Vincentian family.

Conference Hospitality Coordinator
Ministers to fellow Vincentians — sends cards makes

Ministers to fellow Vincentians—sends cards, makes check-in calls, and coordinates care when someone is ill or grieving.

Friend-of-the-Poor-Focused Roles

- Initial Contact with Friends in Need Answers calls, gathers initial information, and identifies the nature of the request. This role may rotate.
- Home Visit Scheduler

Matches incoming requests with available home visit teams. Also potentially a rotating duty.

• Home Visit Captain

Onboards new home visitors, ensures training is current, and maintains home visit protocols.

Resource Collector

Maintains and distributes current referral information for social services and community resources.

Food Program Roles

- Food Supply Coordinator Ensures a steady flow of food donations and oversees food drives.
- Food Storage Coordinator Manages the food inventory and ensures items are stored safely and accessibly.
- Food Bag/Box Committee Chair Organizes the packing and distribution of food items. Oversees volunteers involved in food pantry operations.

Administrative and Support Roles

- Conference Records Coordinator Maintains documentation related to neighbors served and assistance provided.
- Members Portal Coordinator Updates the National SVdP database and keeps internal member lists current.
- **Reminder Calls** Makes reminder calls or sends messages 2–3 days before each meeting to encourage attendance.
- Information Liaison Reviews SVdP National Newsletters, Voice of the Poor newsletters, and reports important updates to the group.

Special Project Roles

• Project Chair

Leads a specific annual or seasonal project (e.g., Thanksgiving Baskets, Christmas Gift Tree, Bundle Sunday, Donut Sales, or Prison Outreach). This is a great role for a newer member looking to get more involved.



A Living Conference is a Shared Conference

When responsibilities are shared, we live out the Vincentian spirit more fully. Delegating roles is not about assigning chores—it's about **inviting others to experience the joy of service**, the peace of prayerful leadership, and the strength of community. Use this list as a starting point to reflect, discern, and reenergize your Conference. Meet with members individually to learn their gifts and interests. A simple conversation might be all it takes to invite someone into deeper service.

MEETING AGENDA

Special Works reports – The only Special Works that conferences have are their pantries. And only if they are done on a regular basis. Handing out a grocery store gift card when a neighbor in need asks for some food is not a special work. Handing out turkeys before Thanksgiving is not a Special Work. Conferences should regularly talk about how to improve their pantries.

FEEDING HOPE – A CHURCH'S MISSION TO SERVE THE

Each week, something beautiful unfolds in our church's parking lot and fellowship hall. There's no stage, no spotlight, no applause—just folding tables, grocery bags, and a faithful team of volunteers quietly serving those in need.

This is more than a food distribution. It's a ministry of love, compassion, and gratitude.

It begins early in the morning as volunteers gather to sort donated groceries from local stores. They check expiration dates, separate fresh produce from pantry goods, and pack each bag with intention and prayer. These bags aren't simply filled with food—they're filled with care, hope, and the quiet wish to lighten someone's burden.

Many of our volunteers have firsthand experience with hardship. Some have known

homelessness. Others have weathered job loss, illness, or family crisis. Now, instead of being served, they are the ones serving—with empathy born from their own experiences. For them, this ministry is deeply personal.

Those who come to receive food are our neighbors—parents, grandparents, elders, and workers juggling multiple jobs who still struggle to make ends meet. They arrive quietly, sometimes with hesitation. But they leave with more than groceries.

They leave with dignity, kindness, and the reassurance that someone sees them... and cares.
