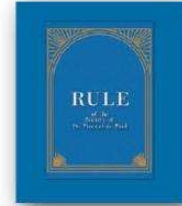

VINCENTIAN GIVING – Twinning

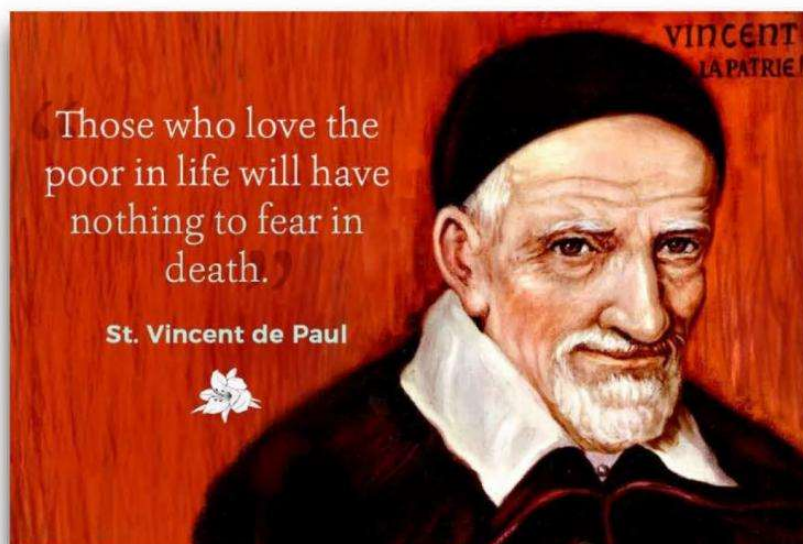
Twinning is an unusual word. In the St. Vincent de Paul world, the word has nothing to do with looking alike, as you might assume from the word Twin. If you look for a definition of the word Twinning, there are several. The one most appropriate for our Society is:

Establishing a partnership and peer relationship to benefit both sides.

Twinning is helping another Conference over time. The most important aspect is that the funds given to another Conference, have no restrictions. The timeframe can be monthly, annually or anything in between, just must be on some type of schedule.

It is NOT called Twinning if two Conferences join forces to help a particular Neighbor in Need. Where there is collaboration to pay bills for a Neighbor, and of course these funds have a restriction, they cannot be called Twinning. The expense can be coded in the financial accounts to be whatever the expense is used for to help that neighbor (utilities, rent, etc.). It also is NOT twinning if a Conference just decides to send money to another Conference for some specific purpose, such as to help pay for food for their pantry, since it has a restriction, it is not twinning. Money sent to any Conference to help during a disaster is coded just as disaster funds, again not twinning, since there is a restriction on the funds.

Twinning is a wonderful concept in the St. Vincent de Paul Society as it reinforces our essential elements. It is helping a Conference who are our friends. It may allow a Conference to do more service to neighbors and reinforces our spirituality in service to help the poor. If you have any question on whether Twinning is the appropriate reference, versus any other coding, you can always call Vincentian Services for assistance.

STATUTE 7 – MEETING ESSENTIALS - SECRET COLLECTION

When the Society was founded, there was no fifth Sunday collection or government grants. The members just passed the hat. They added money if they had some. They took money for neighbors that needed it. Unlike funds donated to the Society, this money can be used for anything that the Conference wants. It is generally put in the general fund to help our neighbors, but, unlike normal donations, it can also be given to other organizations, And it can be used for doughnuts at the start of the meeting, especially if the District Council president is going to be visiting, or even pizza afterwards. Because the conference members need to be able to look every donor in their eyes and say that every penny donated to the Society goes to help our neighbors in need, the secret collection can serve as a slush fund for things the conference wants to do that does not directly help our neighbors.)

MOST EFFICIENT WAY TO FIND INFORMATION ABOUT SVdP

Vincentians complain that it is hard to find what they need to know on National's website and on the DC website. Instead of guessing which links to click on those websites or doing an internet search that will bring up items from every SVdP website, you can do a specific search on National's site or on our District Council website. Let's say that you have a question on twinning, in your browser simple type in either:

Site:ssvpusa.org twinning or Site:svdp-cc.org twinning

And hopefully you will find what you are looking for.

If you are familiar with AI you can even type "search ssvpusa.org for documents on twinning" into Copilot and not only will you get a list of the documents, but also a short summary of what twinning is. Interestingly enough, Copilot could not find any documents on the DC website specifically on twinning so it referred you to the National website and gave you a brief description of twinning. But the standard search listed several documents that mentioned twinning on the DC website and they would probably give someone all of the information that they needed to know.

COAT DISTRIBUTION 2025 – by Dicki Lulay, St. Anne Conference Presdient

We collected and distributed about 700 coats and sweatshirts. Items came from the Brentwood Thrift Store, parishioners through the Spring Coat Drive (and ongoing contributions), local schools and the remainder of the coats purchased last year.

We were able to track that we handed out 303 coats/vests this year vs. 267 coats/vests in 2024. It is estimated that we had at least 200 sweatshirts and parishioners took about half of these. The remaining coats/sweatshirts were bagged and taken directly to Hijas del Campos for distribution.
