

### **TOUGH LOVE**

Steve Krank would constantly tell me something an old priest once told him: “A mother’s love has killed more alcoholics than alcohol.” How many times have you seen someone enable a neighbor with a substance problem or being fiscally irresponsible rather than enabling them to improve themselves? Unfortunately, I have seen very little from SVdP on tough love. After all, if you see the face of Christ in the person you are helping, how can tell the neighbor that you are not going to help them in the way that they want to be helped? But isn’t it required in some situations? I have given tough love to our neighbors that I have visited, but I don’t know if I could do it with my own daughters. My sister knows two families whose children got hooked on drugs and they finally gave up on paying for their rehab stints. One gave their daughter a bus ticket that was good for any trip and told her that once she was ready to change that they would welcome her back home with open arms. The other family had money and a lot of land, so they built a tiny house in their backyard for their son. He was banned from their house, but he could do whatever he wanted in his own house. They figured it was safer for him to use drugs there than in a homeless camp. After several years, the daughter returned home and got clean. I don’t know the fate of the son. I am not sure which method is best, and it probably depends upon the individual. But I have seen a lot of times when tough love was the answer, and Steve has a lot of examples. But are we prepared to do it?

## **FEBRUARY 7TH – FEAST OF BLESSED ROSALIE RENDU**



As Vincentians, we joyfully celebrate the feast day of **Blessed Rosalie Rendu** on **February 7**, a woman whose life embodied the very heart of our Vincentian mission.

Born in France in 1786, Blessed Rosalie became a Daughter of Charity at a young age and spent more than fifty years serving the poor in the streets and slums of Paris. She was known for her deep compassion, fearless advocacy, and unwavering trust in God's providence. During times of political unrest, violence, and extreme poverty, Rosalie remained steadfast — feeding the hungry, caring for the sick, sheltering the homeless, and defending the dignity of every person she encountered.

She did not simply offer material assistance; she offered **presence, respect, and love**. Blessed Rosalie saw Christ in the poor and helped others do the same, forming young people and future leaders — including Frédéric Ozanam — in the spirit of

charity rooted in faith. One of her most well-known quotes reminds us of the posture we are called to take in our service:

**“But be kind and love, for love is your first gift to the poor. They will appreciate your kindness and your love more than all else you bring them.”**

Blessed Rosalie teaches us that Vincentian service is not about efficiency alone, but about **love that is personal, patient, and courageous**. Her life calls us to serve with open hearts, trusting that when we encounter the poor with humility and compassion, we encounter Christ himself. May her example continue to inspire us to live our Vincentian vocation with joy, simplicity, and deep charity.


